

If you want to break a cell phone contract because your carrier doesn't sell the phone you want or you simply can't afford the service any longer, you do have options. Consider the following methods to break a cellphone contract that may allow you to get a cancellation or transfer the contract without

Step 1 Ask for a cancellation for poor service quality. Some service providers will allow you to break a cell phone contract if the reception is inadequate in the areas where you frequently use the phone. **Step 2** Study your cell phone contract to determine if there has been a change in the terms. If you discover additional fees, new charges or different features made to the agreement without your permission, you have a basis for breaking the cell phone contract. Check for items like increases to administrative charges or changes to text messaging prices, for example. **Step 3**

Check with your cell phone service provider to determine if they'll let you transfer the cell phone contract with an Assumption of Liability transfer.
